

Eastlake Pool Rules

1. A bather using the facility must take a cleansing shower before entering the pool enclosure. A bather leaving the pool to use the toilet must take a second cleansing shower before returning to the pool enclosure.
2. A person having a communicable disease transmissible by water must be excluded from public pools. A person having any exposed sub-epidermal tissue, including open blisters, cuts, or other lesions may not use a public pool. A person who has or has had diarrhea within the last two weeks caused by an unknown source or from any communicable or fecal-borne disease may not enter the pool.
3. Any child under three years old, any child not toilet trained, and any one who lacks control of defecation shall wear a water resistant swim diaper and waterproof swim wear. Swim diapers and waterproof swim wear shall have waist and leg openings fitted such that they are in contact with the waist or leg around the entire circumference.
4. All food and glass containers are not permitted in the pool and locker room area. Smoking and alcohol are prohibited on the premises.
5. Please walk on the pool deck. Roughhousing, dunking, shoulder fights and abusive language are not permitted.
6. Diapers shall be changed only in restrooms or changing stations and shall not be changed at pool side. The person who changes the diaper must wash their hands thoroughly with soap before returning to the pool. The diapered person must undergo a cleansing shower before returning to pool.
7. * Inner tubes, inflatable baby carriers, or any large pool toys/objects that may impede the lifeguard's ability to see all areas of the pool are strictly prohibited. Items below are allowed in the pool:
 - Soft or inflatable pool toys 12" or less in diameter.
 - Water noodles
 - Coastguard Approved Personal Floatation Devices (see PFD info sheet for more information)
 - Water wings
8. *Persons 14 years of age and over must have a valid Daybreak resident ID to be admitted to the facility.
9. *Children 13 years of age and younger must be accompanied by responsible individual 18 years of age or older.
10. *A responsible individual 18+ years of age must accompany all children under 9 in the water and be within arms reach at all times.
11. *Diving, flips, twists, back dives, and all other unsafe activities are prohibited.

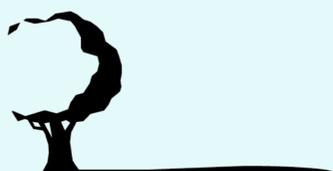

Spa Rules

1. Elderly persons and those suffering from heart disease, diabetes or high blood pressure should consult a physician before using spa.
2. Persons suffering from a communicable disease transmissible via water may not use the spa.
3. Persons using prescription drugs should consult a physician before using spa.
4. Individuals under the influence of alcohol, or other impairing chemical substances, should not use the spa.
5. Bathers should not use the spa alone.
6. Pregnant women should not use spa without consulting a physician.
7. Bathers should not spend more than 15 minutes in the spa in any one session.
8. Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied and supervised in the hot tub by at least one responsible individual 18+ years of age.*
9. Children under the age of 5 years are prohibited from bathing in the spa.
10. Running or engaging in unsafe activities or horseplay by or around the spa is prohibited.
