

Common Oquirrh Lake Questions

How much is a boat permit for the 2019 Season? \$12.00

Why do I need a permit? This permit helps pay for the cost of the sticker, which ensures that the amenity is used by Daybreak residents and that the proper types of vessels are used on the lake.

Where can I obtain a permit? At the Daybreak Community Center front desk. The DCC is open Mon-Thurs 5:30 am - 10:00 pm, Fri 5:30 am - 8 pm, and Sat-Sun 7 am - 5 pm.

What kinds of watercraft are allowed on the lake? Personal non-motorized boats which includes kayaks, canoes, row boats and paddle boards that do not exceed 17 feet in length. *Inflatable watercraft must be inspected by the Harbor Master before a permit can be placed on the vessel. Only authorized motorized boats operated by the community association are permitted.

What are the hours of operation for the lake? Dusk to dawn, but staff hours are shown below:

Can I go fishing? Yes, catch and release is allowed. You will also need a valid Utah State fishing license.

Am I allowed to bring a guest? Yes, the cost is \$5.00.

Can my guest check out a boat? No, but a resident can with the guest as a passenger.

Can I rent a boat? Yes.

How much does it cost to rent? It is free for residents.

How long can I have the rental? 1.5 hours.

Do I need to make a reservation to use the boats? Boat usage at the Daybreak Boat Facility will be on a first come, first serve basis.

Can I swim in the lake? NO.

Can my dog swim in the lake? Your dog must be on a leash at all times, and is not allowed in the water.

Where is the Boat Ramp? On the east side of Kestrel Ride Road, 0.2 miles north of West Daybreak Parkway (approximately 11121 Kestrel Rise Road).
